



**Community Care Family Care Partnership Program (HMO SNP)**

**Monthly Plan Premium for People who get Extra Help from Medicare to Help Pay for their Prescription Drug Costs**

If you get extra help from Medicare to help pay for your Medicare prescription drug plan costs, your monthly plan premium will be lower than what it would be if you did not get extra help from Medicare. The amount of extra help you get will determine your total monthly plan premium as a member of our Plan.

This table shows you what your monthly plan premium will be if you get extra help.

Your level of extra help	Monthly Premium for Community Care Family Care Partnership Program (HMO SNP)*
100%	\$0
75%	Does not apply
50%	Does not apply
25%	Does not apply

\* This does not include any Medicare Part B premium you may have to pay.

The Community Care Family Care Partnership Program (HMO SNP) premium includes coverage for both medical services and prescription drug coverage.

Community Care is a Coordinated Care plan with a Medicare Advantage Contract and a contract with the Wisconsin Department of Health Services for the Medicaid Program. Enrollment in Community Care depends on contract renewal. Enrollment is available to anyone who has both Medical Assistance from the State and Medicare and is functionally eligible as determined by the Wisconsin Long-Term Care Functional Screen.

Benefits, formulary, pharmacy network, premiums and/or copayments/coinsurance may change on January 1 of each year.

For most Community Care members, Medicaid pays for your Part B premium.
